FUNDING AVAILABLE

VETIS funding eligibility

Senior high school students who are Australian or New Zealand Citizens or permanent residents, or temporary residents with the necessary visa, are eligible to utilise VETIS funding. Subsidised by the Queensland Government under the Vocational Education and Training in Schools Program (VETIS). Students are eligible to use VETIS funding to complete one program only. FEE FOR SERVICE

Fee-for-Service (not government subsidised)

Students who are not eligible for VETiS funding or who have already utilised their VETiS funding entitlement are not excluded from this course. The cost to students who are not eligible for VETiS funding is \$998.00.

SCHOOL HOLIDAY WORKSHOP

8th to 12th April

One week compulsory Block Training. Students undertake practical learning and assessment.



ONLINE SELF-PACED STUDIES

15th April to 21st June

10 weeks of online self-paced studies. Students will need to commit to 4 hours of study per week.
